# What is an Early Middle College Program?

- Opportunity to pursue an Associate Degree, tuition free, while still in high school.
- Blend of H.S. and College Courses in 5 years
  - Diploma and Associate's Degree after 13th year

# Why E/MC Program?

- Provide supports to increase post-secondary learning
- Increase college opportunities
- Reduce financial burden on families
- Expand the traditional view of High School
- Produce college and career ready graduates

# Who would be target population for E/MC?

- Students considering community college
- Students considering an Associates Degree
- Students considering alternate path to four year university
- Students academically ready for program
- Students committed to completing high school in 5 years
  - Must commit prior to 10th grade
- First generation college students

# How does E/MC work at WBSD?

- Onsite classes through 10th grade, then on college campus in 11th grade.
- Coordination between college advisor and WBSD to Diploma and Degree requirements.
- College credits would cite on transcript similar to our dual enrollment we have in place.
- Graduation requirements would not change other than math requirement being in 5th year.



# Sample Student Schedule / Pathway

WCCCD courses are held on WCCCD campus and transportation is the responsibility of the student.

The following schedule structure is required to meet the standard of a full-time student.

**9th grade - 5 WBSD/1 WCCCD**

**10th grade - 5 WBSD/1 WCCCD**

**11th grade - at minimum 3 WBSD/2 WCCCD**

\*There is some flexibility in the 11th grade year to have students take science or social studies through WCCCD to free up elective spots or move required courses to the 12th grade year to accommodate electives.

**12th grade - at minimum 2 WBSD/3 WCCCD**

**13th year- 4 WCCCD courses.**

\*May vary based on credit and type of degree.

\*Students must meet the MMC requirement to complete 1 math credit in their final year of high school

# EMC Student Weekly Schedules

- Courses at WBSD buildings | during Freshman, Sophomore, and half of Junior year.
  - Classes are built into the students hourly class schedule
  - Classes do not meet on Fridays
  - Classes end on WCCCD schedule semester schedule, so a few weeks earlier than WBSD semester.
  - Commitment to studying and completing work outside of the school day.
- Courses held at WCCCD campus | 2nd semester Junior year, Senior, 13th year
  - Class will not meet everyday: once, twice, or three times a week.
  - Classes meet in the afternoon or evenings.
  - Transportation not provided
