



Site Information: What is Early Head Start?

Early Head Start:

- Serves pregnant moms, babies and toddlers birth to 3 years of age.
- Provides support to low income infants, toddlers, pregnant women and their families.
- Enhances children's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development.
- Assists pregnant women to access comprehensive pre-natal and post-partum care.
- Supports parent's efforts to set family goals.
- Offers a variety of ways for parents/family members to participate.
- Early and continuing assessments.
- Supports transition of baby into home-based and center-based program.
- Babies and toddlers with special needs and Early-On IFSP are eligible.

How do I know if my child is eligible?

- Women who are pregnant or have an infant aged 6 weeks, baby or toddler up to $2\frac{1}{2}$ years old are eligible.
- Must provide proof of income eligibility within the federal program guidelines.

What do I need to bring to enroll?

Proof of Income: (all that apply)

- W-2's or 1040 tax return (Prepared by a certified tax preparer) for past calendar year
- Unemployment-1099
- TANF Cash Assistance-Benefit letter
- Foster Care stipends
- Child Support-End of year statement
- SSI/SSD-end of the year award letter
- School grants or scholarship letter

Proof of Birth: (one required)

Child's birth certificate, Hospital Record or Affidavit of parentage

Child's Immunization Record:

Up to date.

Proof of Identity/Residency: (one required)

• Driver's License or state ID

Child's Health Insurance Card:

Medicaid, private and Insurance provider card

Medical Provider's Information:

Doctor's, Dentist names address and phone numbers.

Emergency Contact Information

Names, address and Phone numbers of friends/relatives over 18 for emergency form

- Provides support to low income preschool age children and their families.
- Enhances children's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development.
- Actively encourages your child's kindergarten readiness.
- Supports parent's efforts to set family goals.
- Offers a variety of ways for parents/family members to participate.
- Health and developmental assessments.
- Children with special needs and school district IEP are eligible.

How do I know if my child is eligible?

- Children must be 3 or 4 years old by the school cut-off date of September 1st.
- Must provide proof of income eligibility within the federal program guidelines.

What do I need to bring to enroll?

Proof of Income: (all that apply)

- W-2's or 1040 tax return(Prepared by a certified tax preparer) for past calendar year
- Unemployment-1099
- TANF Cash Assistance-Benefit letter
- Foster Care stipends
- Child Support-End of year statement
- SSI/SSD-end of the year award letter
- School Grants or Scholarships

What is GSRP?

Great Start School Readiness Program:

- Serves children who are four years old by September 1st, the school cut-off date.
- Provides support to families with risk factors.
- Enhances children's physical, social, emotional and intellectual development.
- Actively encourages your child's kindergarten readiness.
- Supports parent's efforts to set family goals.
- Offers a variety of ways for parents/family members to participate.
- Health and developmental assessments.
- Children with special needs and school district IEP are eligible.
- A full day of preschool services blended with state or/and federal funds.

How do I know if my child is eligible?

- Children must 4 years old by the school cut-off date of September 1st.
- Must provide proof of income eligibility within the GSRP guidelines.

What do I need to bring to enroll?

Proof of Income: (all that apply)

- W-2's or 1040 tax return(Prepared by a certified tax preparer) for past calendar year
- Unemployment-1099
- TANF Cash assistance-Benefit letter
- Foster Care stipends
- Child Support-End of year statement
- SSI/SSD-end of the year award letter
- School Grants or Scholarships

Proof of Birth: (one required)
