Maple Grove Alternative High School Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Who can enroll in Maple Grove? Any student in grades 9-12.
- Is there a cost to attend Maple Grove?
 No. Maple Grove is a part of the Woodhaven-Brownstown School District which means there is no charge at all to students.
- 3. How and when can a student enroll?

 A student can enroll anytime. Simply, call 734-783-3333 to make an appointment or visit Woodhaven High School.
- 4. What are the attendance requirements?
 Attendance will be based on student progress within their class and hours logged. Students are required to come to the learning lab at WHS once a week to check in, take tests, and get help. Students must also attend to take the State tests (SAT or PSAT or MStep) in April.
- What type of Diploma will a MGAHS graduate receive?
 A fully endorsed Maple Grove High School Diploma from Woodhaven-Brownstown School district.
- 6. Does MGAHS provide Special Ed and personalized curriculum?

Students in Special Education Programs are provided with Teacher Consultant Services through an IEPT. Students may be offered a Personal Curriculum if it meets with their post-secondary goals.

7. Can a student be enrolled in MGAHS and still take Career-Technical Classes?

Yes. Students can be enrolled in traditional career-tech classes through the DCTC program. Classes such as welding, health Occupations, construction trades, auto services, graphics, EMT, cosmetology, culinary arts, IT programs, and more.

- 8. Does a MGAHS student have to login at specific times? Are there live sessions Students can log in at any time?

 Students are not required to log in during a specific time.

 Each course has optional live sessions to offer lectures on the content.
- 9. When are students able to log into classes?
 Students can work at any time. 365 days a year. 24 hours a day.
- 10. What is the oldest a student can be to enroll?

 Students can enroll in Maple Grove if they are less than 22 years of age as of September 1st of the school year.
- 11. How long does it take to complete one course?

 It depends on how hard a student works. On average, students should complete one course per month. The harder a student works, the faster they can complete classes. Some students pass classes faster than once a month, some take longer.
- 12. When do students physically have to be on campus?
 Students need to be in the learning lab at least one hour per week. They can check in with their mentor teachers, take tests, or get help. Student may come to the lab to get one-on-one, face- to-face help as needed.
- 13. **If a student is struggling, what supports are available?** There are a multitude of help available to the students from their online teacher and their mentors, including individual tutoring. As students' progress through courses, additional supports will be crafted to meet student needs.
- 14. Can a student still be involved in athletic teams or extracurricular clubs or events?

Students in Maple Grove may not participate in WHS athletics, clubs, or events.

- 15. How can parent/guardians check on student progress?

 Parent accounts can be created to allow parents to check progress and grades, and parents can call, email, or visit their student's mentor teacher.
- 16. **Does MGAHS** provide internet and a laptop? Yes.
- 17. What are the graduation requirements?

 Students will fulfill the requirements of the Michigan Merit
 Curriculum.

Michigan Merit Curriculum 18 credits:

- 4 credits (8 classes) in English
- 4 credits (8 classes) in Math
- 3 credits (8 classes) in Social Studies
- 3 credits (8 classes) in Science
- 1 or 2 credits (2/4 classes) in a foreign language
- 1 or 2 classes (2/4 classes) in VPAA
- 1 credit (2 classes) in P.E and Health

Students create a Graduation Plan when enrolling. This plan details the specific classes each student will need to graduate when a counselor/mentor reviews their transcript.
