Mission

To support and connect Michigan families of children and youth with special health care needs, provide family-centered leadership throughout Michigan's health care settings, and partner in decision making within the systems of care for children and youth with special health care needs.

Family Center for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (Family Center)

- •The parent-directed center within Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS)
- Staffed by parents of children with special needs
- Can be a voice and bring a family perspective
- Promotes family/professional partnerships





Family Center Staff

- Staff of parents who have children with special health care needs
- Trained as parent mentors
- Understands the complex needs of families
- Can help to ease isolation for new parents

- Parent to Parent Support Network
- Evidence-based model of peer support
- Can be matched with a Parent Mentor
- Match made based on needs of referred parent
- Statewide trainings to become a Parent Mentor
- Alliance Member of Parent to Parent USA









Part of the Parent-to-Parent USA Model:

- There are 38 states that are Alliance Members of Parent-to-Parent USA
- ➤ We are Michigan's Parent to Parent Support Network.
- ➤ We also have connections with Parent-to-Parent organizations abroad and can provide match support internationally if needed

Family Center Parent Mentor Trainings

- ➤Our Parent Mentor trainings are based on the Parent-to-Parent national model. It is a parent-directed, evidence-based model of support.
- The training demonstrates best practices for parents of children with special needs to support their peers.
- ➤ The mentor model is not limited to medical diagnoses. It also includes all children who have, or are at an increased risk for: physical, developmental, behavioral or emotional conditions.


Why Parent-to-Parent Support?



- 58% of parents/caregivers spend more than 40 hours per week providing support for their family member with intellectual/developmental disabilities
- ➤ 46% of parents/caregivers report that they have more caregiving responsibilities than they can handle
- > 88% of caregivers report physical fatigue
- 81% of caregivers report emotional stress

Effectiveness of Parent-to-Parent Support



- Parents feel more equipped to cope with their child and their situation
- Parents are able to view their family and circumstances more positively
- Parents value helping other parents make progress toward their own goals
- Parents feel empowered to partner in the decision making process

Family Center Scholarships

Camp Scholarships

- Covers children/youth with special needs, ages 5-21
- Not based on family income first come, first served basis
- Do not need to qualify for CSHCS any disability or diagnosis
- Does not need to be an overnight camp or special needs camp
- Camp must be licensed or be connected to a school or city/township Parks and Recreation



Family Center Scholarships

Conference Scholarships

- Not based on family income first come, first served basis
- Do not need to qualify for CSHCS any disability or diagnosis
- Covers one parent and/or youth ages 14 26
- Conference must be in the continental US not limited to Michigan
